We have an interesting story from our Speaker for February... Beverly Ziarko She is WASA Vice President/Database Manager.....

I lost my hearing at 21 due to otosclerosis and fought a raging battle against my new hearing aid/lifestyle. Fifteen years, hearing aids in both ears, some resignation and a family later, I moved to northern California. There was an article in the paper about SHHH sometime near 1984 and I went to my first meeting. I became active in several SHHH groups around the Diablo Valley chapter and learned more at those meetings about how to help myself than I had ever learned from an audiologist or dispenser. Through a co-SHHH'r, I discovered I qualified for the CA State Department of Rehabilitation. I credit these support systems with teaching me how to have confidence in the skills and aids I do have and helping me ease back into the workforce. Then 12 years ago I moved to Kent, Washington. To my delight, there was again an article in my local paper; this time about Gordon Nystedt and SHHH. I tootled right on down to the next South King County SHHH meeting which happened to be officer elections! For the next 4 years, I served as newsletter editor. I did take a break for a few years, but I'm back now and have lots to say about SHHH, support, and hearing aids!!

MN Rep Koskinen 1/18/01, HF 221, SF 186 All 80% of the cost of covered services in access of an annual deductible, which does not exceed \$150 per person, limited to \$3000 per person. Maximum lifetime benefit of not less than \$500,000. Prescribed by an audiologist or hearing aid specialist or, for an adult, anyone who is certified to dispense.

MO Rep Holt 2001 HB 341 All Not specified Shall provide hearing aid coverage that is not subject to any greater deductible or co-payment than other similar health care services provided by the plan.

NJ A.M. Impeveduto, Sen. Cafiero 1/8/02, A569 S. 304 All N/A First-time purchase and fitting for each impaired ear; not to exceed \$6000 per person

NJ A.M. Cottrell 1/8/02, A741 All As needed, as determined by such providers as the insurer deems appropriate, including dispensers Covers medically necessary expenses incurred in the purchase of a HA.. Shall not contain a preexisting condition limitation

NJ A.M. Cottrell, Sen. Singer 5/9/02, A. 2276, S. 846 All At least every 48 months One analog or digital hearing aid for each ear when medially necessary and as prescribed or recommended by a licensed physician or audiologist; the insurer may limit the benefit to \$1,000 per hearing aid fore each hearing-impaired ear every 24 months.

NJ A.M. Coniglio 6/20/02, A. 2447 Children As medically necessary or appropriate Covers purchase of a hearing aid for each ear, as prescribed or recommended by the hearing aid provider as deemed appropriate by the medical provider, including hearing aid dispensers.

NY A.M. Morelle 5/23/01, A. 8896S. 5692A All Adults: every 4 years; children: every 2 years provided that their condition has severely deteriorated.

Covers cost of hearing aids of at least \$1,000 for costs related to the purchase of 2 hearing aids.

OH Rep. Miller HB 110, 2002-2002 session All Not specified Covers 50% of the total cost of the hearing aids; Has to be prescribed by a physician, dispensed by a physician, or licensed audiologist or hearing aid dealer or fitter; also, if approval for use of federal funds is granted under the Social Security Act, the medial assistance program shall include benefits for the total cost of hearing aids.

OH Rep. Miller 2002-2002 session, HB 136 State employees Not specified Benefits for hearing exams and hearing aids to be included as part of the health coverage benefits offered to state of Ohio employees.

OK Rep Easley, Rep Blackburn Sen. Cain 2002 session HB 2178, SB 1641 Children up to 16 years Not specified Provides for coverage for audiological services and hearing aids for children

OR Rep Walker 2001 Session, HB 3185 All Every 48 months Covers the cost of one hearing aid per hearing impaired ear up to \$1200 per hearing aid. Insured my chose a higher priced HA and pay the difference in cost.

PA Sen Schwartz 2/15/01, SB 517 Children Not specified Shall include coverage for hearing aids for children under 18 years of age.

Every 36 months Coverage for HA's and related services; up to \$1400 per hearing aid; the insured may choose a higher priced HA and may pay the difference in cost; "related services" means earmolds, initial batteries, and other necessary equipment, maintenance and adaptation training; services to be provided by a professional licensed to provide such services; excludes Medicare.

WI Rep Lehman 2001-2002 session;
A.130 All Not specified The cost of up to \$1,000 of hearing aids for an insured under the policy who is certified as hearing impaired by a licensed audiologist; the cost of hearing testing,
